

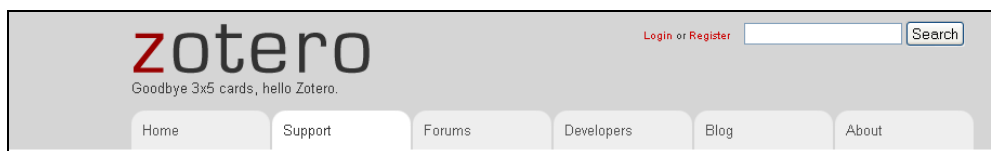
'Classic' EndNote

- available on PWFs; for sale from University Computing Service; supported by UCS training
- stores unlimited references, lets you create personalised features
- desktop-based (runs on a single machine) but can connect to selected online databases



www.endnoteweb.com or via Web of Knowledge at www.lib.cam.ac.uk/electronicresources

- free to UCam members; gives you web-based reference storage that works with any browser
- can store up to 10,000 references
- allows you to share your references



www.zotero.org

- free of charge, but you must use Mozilla Firefox as your browser (also free!)
- offers one-click storing of citations
- recognises bibliographic entries from many sources including library catalogues
- current version (1.0) is desktop-based; web syncing is in beta testing

... and for storing and sharing websites



www.delicious.com

- free of charge; works with any browser
- allows easy bookmarking and sharing of useful sites
- one of many **social bookmarking** sites: if you don't like this one, try another!
