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The Taylor-Schechter Genizah Collection is a window on the medieval world unlike any other, and provides an unparalleled resource for the academic study of Judaism, Jewish history and the wider history of the Mediterranean and Near East. In 1896–7 the enterprising Cambridge scholar Solomon Schechter, with help from his colleague Charles Taylor, recovered the manuscripts from the 'genizah' of the Ben Ezra Synagogue in Fustat, Old Cairo: a storeroom where worn-out sacred texts were kept. The Genizah Research

Unit was established to carry out a comprehensive programme of conservation, cataloguing and research on the manuscripts, which is leading to all manner of important discoveries about religion, literary traditions and inter-faith relations.
