**Garamond** which was designed by Jean Jannon in Sedan circa 1621 and attributed originally in error to the famous punch cutter Claude Garamond in Paris. Monotype Garamond was the first series to be cut by The Monotype Corporation Limited during an ambitious programme of matrix production which began in 1922. Monotype Garamond reproduced closely the original typeface which was attributed to Jannon following research which was carried out in 1926 by Paul Beaujon, whose real name was Beatrice Warde.

## Preface

Monotype as such began in 1889 with the invention of a composing machine which was devised by Tolbert Lanston (1844-1913), an American who experimented with the use of molten metal to cast individual pieces of printing type by mechanical means. The caster was driven by paper tape which was punched by a keyboard operator. The equipment worked with remarkable accuracy and definition by producing type that was indistinguishable from that produced by the use of hitherto conventional methods.

Lanston patented his 'Monotype' machine in 1893 and founded the Lanston Corporation Incorporated to market it. In 1897 the company began trading in Britain as the Lanston Monotype Corporation and by 1920 about one hundred and fifty typefaces had been cut by it. In 1931 the company was floated on the London Stock Exchange and renamed The Monotype Corporation Limited.

Most of the typefaces were designed by the staff of the company's Typographical Drawing Office but during the period between the two world wars, a growing number of distinguished international designers contributed to a wealth of type families and series. Prominent among those who contributed to the success of type founding at Monotype, were Adrian Frutiger, Eric Gill, David Kindersley, Jan van Krimpen, Giovanni Mardersteig, Stanley Morison, Jan Tshichold, Beatrice Warde, Berthold Wolpe and Hermann Zapf.

By 1978 the Monotype Corporation was in receivership and passed into the hands of the Grendon Trust, effectively an asset stripper. The company was rescued by a joint effort by Barclays Bank Limited and the National Enterprise Board. The restoration of the company coincided with the introduction of phototypesetting, when the laser scanning and digitising of typographical images replaced the casting of metal type. With renewed vigour the company undertook the considerable task of digitising the contents of the Monotype Typeface Library and the name Lasercomp joined Monotype as a registered trademark.

Despite the success of Lasercomp it became necessary to seek further financial support in the City of London during 1983 and although the company returned to profit during 1986, it did so with the loss of over half of the workforce and forfeited its listing on the Stock Exchange. Continuing in financial insecurity the company was bought by Pointplus in 1989 but despite the development of PostScript which would replace Lasercomp, recovery proved elusive. The company was placed in receivership again during 1992, following which its ownership changed once again and with a workforce reduced still further.

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## Introduction

The Cambridge Monotype Project was founded for Cambridge University Library in 1987 with the support of Dr Frederick H Ratcliffe, the University Librarian and Herr René Kerfante, the Managing Director of Monotype Typography Limited, a division of The Monotype Corporation P L C.

By 1985 the process of casting printing type by the use of molten metal, had passed into history and the progress of the development of digitised typesetting was advancing rapidly, enabled by the improvement of imaging and laser technology. At about that time I became concerned to notice with reference to the documentation published by The Monotype Corporation and Monotype Typography and present in the University Library, the absence of some representation, some broken continuity and certain other omissions which if not rectified quickly, might continue indefinitely. Noticing that more recent publications had not been forthcoming, I felt that some attempt should be made

to secure the fullest possible representation of Monotype material in the university, before it became too late. Having regard for the extent of the existing material present, together with the contents of the Morison Collection which had been bequeathed to the library by the late Stanley Morison, I approached Dr Ratcliffe and the Deputy Librarian, John Hall, with the suggestion that a formal approach might be made to Monotype about a Cambridge Monotype Project.

Monotype had experienced mixed fortunes in recent years, having been rescued from insolvency in 1978 and 1983 and re-floated in 1986 but with the loss of over half of the workforce which remained following earlier reduction. The challenging situation with which the company was faced led me to fear some possible curtailment of the publication of new material, including the long-established and prestigious periodical *The Monotype Recorder*. Stocks of current printed matter, together with an unknown quantity of older documentation might be at risk, some of which I believed to have been taken to the headquarters of the company at Salfords near Redhill, following the earlier closure of the office in Fetter Lane in the City of London.

Some good material had continued to appear during the tenure of John Latham, who was successively Director of Typography of Monotype Typographical and Managing Director of its successor, Monotype Typography. At the instigation of Latham a new series entitled *The Monotype Letters* was published during 1983, to address the advent of a new generation of office machines which incorporated new technology. The first edition of a new series of *The Monotype Recorder* had been published during 1980, under the imprint of Monotype International but the quarterly publication planned had been lost and by 1987 only six issues had appeared.

By 1986 the unfortunate effects of the changes of ownership, of the progress of technological change and a diminishing establishment were becoming very evident, leading me to fear the demise of the wealth of typographical documentation that had been the hallmark of the Monotype Corporation for almost a century. As the company faltered, I wondered what might be done to secure the best possible representation of the published output of the company, before it became too late.

During the summer of 1987 I moved to Cambridge and assisted ably by Nicholas Smith, I began to look more closely at the existing Monotype material present in the Department of Rare Books and to document it as fully as possible. During 1988 I discussed my proposal with René Kerfante and put to him the suggestion that in view of the long term association of Monotype and the late Stanley Morison with the university, any material which the company felt able to donate to the University Library, would be as valuable as it would be appropriate.

The response to my proposal from both René Kerfante and his deputy, David Saunders, was an offer of their fullest support which I was pleased to convey to Dr Ratcliffe and Nicholas Smith.

Dr Ratcliffe suggested in turn that in view of the dispersal of the material relevant to Monotype between the Broxbourne, Hutt and Morison Collections, I might look at all of the Monotype material present in the library and create an inventory to be made available in the form of a handlist, on floppy disk, on line and as hard copies to be printed as required. It followed that the additional material donated by Monotype would be incorporated as it was received, checked for duplication and itemised.

David Hall, Senior Under-Librarian, was asked to act as my contact in the library, whereupon Nicholas Smith arranged to make the relevant collections available to me and

as a keyboard could not be used in the Department of Rare Books, to keep me supplied with index cards, on which I made entries by hand. Dedicated reference to the Monotype material in the library being unavailable and existing references being confined to headline descriptions, I found it expedient to write an index card for each item, the back being useful for the entry of any additional notes and queries.

The Morison Collection is of particular importance for comprising the letters, papers and ephemera which were bequeathed to Cambridge University Library by Stanley Morison, who died in 1967. During 1989 a commemorative exhibition was staged in the library to commemorate the birth of Morison, who was perhaps best known for his guidance of the design of the Times family of typefaces. Morison was commissioned by Times Newspapers Limited in 1928 and the eponymous face was revealed in 1932, when it was used for the first time, to print *The Times* on October 3.

Stanley Morison made a distinguished and wide contribution to typography and printing, principally at the Monotype Corporation and as typographical adviser to Cambridge University Press. Together with Eric Gill, Beatrice Warde and their counterparts, Morison became a central figure. He exemplified the enterprise and enthusiasm which created and sustained the period of typographical excellence which developed following the First World War and continued after the Second.

Having written an index card for every relevant item that I had found in the library, David Saunders at Salfords and I liaised to determine what appeared to be absent and present respectively, in the light of our searches. At the same time copies of all current publications were added to provide continuity in recent documentation.

Meanwhile at Monotype a thorough examination of all of the earlier printed material at Salfords was instigated by David Saunders, whose team of helpers examined, reported, sorted and transferred all that was deemed to be relevant. The transfer of material to Cambridge continued from time to time, being brought by David Saunders personally on one occasion, whereupon Nicholas Smith treated him to an impromptu display of appropriate engaging items.

By 1991 the transfer of material from Monotype was nearing completion and its condition was remarkable, for almost every item was being received in perfect or near perfect condition. Despite considerable success it had become clear that a fully comprehensive collection could not be realised, for despite the diligence of David Saunders and his team, several omissions could not be rectified and some breaks of continuity could not be eliminated. I was able to close or reduce a few gaps in some series which were represented and to provide examples of others which were not, from my own library, not least by improving the continuity of *The Monotype Recorder*.

As completion drew closer our thoughts turned towards arrangements for the formal presentation of the proceeds of the project to the University Librarian. On April 17 a reception was held in the Sir Geoffrey Keynes Room in the University Library, when René Kerfante, David Saunders and I, accompanied by my wife, Urszula, presented Dr Ratcliffe with the material which we had acquired, in the presence of David Hall, Nicholas Smith and Roy Welbourn.

Meanwhile Monotype announced its intention to withdraw its laser typesetting system, Lasercomp, at the end of 1992. It seemed essential that Lasercomp should be represented in the library, so it occurred to me that perhaps the famous Gardiner

Hieroglyphic font might be an ideal choice. The font had had a particularly interesting existence which culminated in its spectacular application at Oxford. I approached John Baines, Professor of Egyptology at the Oriental Institute in Oxford, with the suggestion that a copy might be devised in the form of a continuous bromide, albeit creating a roll of some length.

John Baines welcomed my proposal, provided some helpful initial documentation and introduced Catherine Griffin at Oxford University Computing Service. Catherine Griffin had been instrumental in making the Lasercomp version of the Gardiner Hieroglyphic font available to the National Academic Typesetting Service.

It is illustrative of the fundamental contribution to typography which has been made by Monotype, to relate in some detail an example of the application of Lasercomp and what was achieved with it. Gardiner Hieroglyphic had been devised by Sir Alan Gardiner in 1927, for the Griffith Institute, to be used by Oxford University Press to print his *Egyptian Grammar*. Following the cessation of printing with cast hot metal type at Oxford, a Monotype Logoscaner machine was installed in 1983 and the original Gardiner font was digitised, enabling the creation of images which had finer definition than those that could be produced with the use of metal type.

In 1985 the Griffith Institute authorised Oxford University Computing Service to acquire a copy of the Gardiner font, to enable the automated setting of hieroglyphic to be made available to the National Academic Typesetting Service, so that anyone could use it. John Baines set out the aims of the programme and its potential uses and devised it with Catherine Griffin, who wrote the programme and Kenneth Beckley, Filmset Printing Manager at Oxford University Press, who digitised the images. The setting of the images which comprised the font was facilitated by an interface called Lasercheck which was written in Fortran and driven by an ICL 2988 mainframe computer. The Lasercheck interface was inserted between the setter, to whom it was invisible and the Lasercomp which was driven by its own computer.

When Lasercomp was withdrawn as announced on New Year's Eve, 1992, to be succeeded by PostScript, Catherine Griffith marked the occasion by producing an excellent result, exactly as envisaged, in the form of a continuous bromide roll with the entire Gardiner font arranged specially in linear format. Despite the spectacular success which was achieved by the use of Lasercomp at Oxford, its withdrawal removed some irritating disadvantages, for differing units of measurement were used as between horizontal and vertical dimensions and both absolute and relative measures were used, too.

Towards the end of 1991 Andrew Boag at Monotype brought to me the proposal that I might revise *Languages of the World* which I had criticised earlier, as constructively as possible, for its inaccuracies and omissions. The work had been published in 1963 as an extended feature in the *Monotype Recorder* and in 1979, it reappeared as part of a special publication to mark the visit of a delegation from China. I felt that the work might be welcomed as a handy concise reference, so early in 1992 I submitted a structured proposal which was accepted but overtaken on March 6, when Arthur Anderson and Company was appointed as the administrative receiver of the company.

With my worst fears realised I received a letter from René Kerfante in which he expressed optimism that the position of the company would improve later in the year. Unwilling to abandon the work, I continued to extend the scope of the Monotype Project to include it, although it was doomed to extinction at Monotype.

As contact with Salfords diminished and although the scope of the Monotype Project was limited by its relevance to the Department of Rare Books in the University Library, I found some time in which to expand upon those aspects of alphabets and syllabaries which might be relevant to a wider and deeper approach to the documentation of the work of the Monotype Corporation and Monotype Typography.

Those languages having non-Latin scripts required particular attention, so I sought the advice of divers senior specialists to whom I became indebted for their correspondence, discussion and guidance which was so fully and so willingly forthcoming. John Chadwick, famous for his *Decipherment of Linear B* and Arthur Woodhead, author of *Study of Greek Inscriptions*, both of whom are retired members of the Mycenaean Epigraphy Group, John Ray and John Cooper in the Faculty of Oriental Studies and John Baines and Catherine Griffin at Oxford, have been especially generous with their time. In return I have been pleased to offer a minor contribution to Oxford University Computing Service, not least in for the contribution which has been made to the Monotype Project by Catherine Griffin. Having become concerned for the future of printed Ancient Greek generally and in respect of the National Academic Typesetting Service in particular, we have discussed the possible development of a font using PostScript by digitising images from formal drawings, using Monotype Porson Greek as a basis, perhaps at least initially.

The demise of printing from metal type has led to some practices which should be deprecated, for example the ad hoc addition of diacritic signs to characters. More especially the facility to print specific signs and symbols in epigraphy has declined to an extent that entries in manuscript have become unavoidable in many instances. With the continued help of John Chadwick and Arthur Woodhead, I have been able to formulate the content of a comprehensive font to include the additional signs and symbols required for epigraphy and to begin to create an inventory of those known recorded signs and symbols which are attributable to Ancient Greek and its dialects.

By 1993 I had finished writing the index cards which I handed to Nicholas Smith, who undertook the laborious task of transferring my entries to the library computer. His work had to be confined to making outline entries so I wrote a duplicate set of cards to enable me to make future reference. All of the Monotype material present in the library being listed thus, a comprehensive inventory became available on line, on floppy disk and in a limited edition of six printed copies. The project seemed to have been worthwhile thus.

By 1994 the Monotype Project had succeeded as fully as circumstances would allow and all that accrued further was a limited number of items which I continued to donate from my own library. From its inception it had been my intention to continue the project with a second phase to provide biographical and other possibly helpful information and with a third phase, to establish a database on which to list every known face and font, together with series, authorisations, issues, revisions and withdrawals. The prospect of implementing such expansion seemed daunting, not least for being beyond the scope of the project as I conceived it. It seemed worthwhile to examine the implications of conducting such an in depth inquiry and recording such detailed documentation nevertheless, so during the closing months of the project I drafted skeletal and other outlines of what might be involved.

Last year I lost effective contact with Monotype Typography Limited, correspondence remained unanswered and the company ceased to exist as I had known it since 1956. The work force which numbered one thousand two hundred in 1986, had been reduced



to three hundred when the company was placed in receivership in 1992. A known further reduction of one hundred has occurred since.

In the absence of sponsorship by Monotype Typography and following the retirement of Dr Ratcliffe, interests and opportunities elsewhere have led me to draw the Cambridge Monotype Project to a possibly overdue close. Although I have reviewed my index cards, together with the initial draft of the printed catalogue, I have found time to enter only a few changes and additions, leaving the creation of any more substantial reference in the hands of Nicholas Smith and his colleagues in the University Library.

It will be clear that it would not have been possible for me to undertake the Cambridge Monotype Project without the external support of René Kerfante and David Saunders at Monotype Typography, of John Baines and Catherine Griffin. To all of them the University owes acknowledgement and thanks as, however humble, another contribution to its history has been made. My thanks are offered to all whom I have mentioned in this introduction and to all who have been creative and inspirational and who have promoted and served typography and printing in the name of Monotype.

This introduction to a putative second edition of a catalogue of what I hope will become known as the Monotype Collection, has been written to celebrate the tenth anniversary of the foundation of the Cambridge Monotype Project, as it coincides with the fortieth anniversary of my first contact with the Monotype Corporation and the centenary of Monotype in this country.
